

## Promoting participatory ICTs for adding value to traditional knowledge in climate change adaptation, advocacy and policy processes in the Caribbean Mobilisation plan

**Objective:** To stimulate interest of key stakeholders to participate in the three dimensional model building exercise in Tobago during the period 29<sup>th</sup> September to 12<sup>th</sup> October 2012

## **Target groups:**

The groups being targeted for participation in the process are:

- 18 representatives from national and regional organisations for the entire period to participate in the training of trainers;
- 40 secondary students from Tobago to assist with the building of the blank model from Friday 28<sup>th</sup> to Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2012:
- 120 informants (community leaders, fisherfolk, farmers, tourism entrepreneurs, NGOs and CBOs, policy makers and resource managers in government agencies, and students) from Tobago to populate the model during the period Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> October to Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> October 2012;and
- 40 observers, drawn from government agencies, academia, regional NGOs and CBOs, regional inter-governmental secretariats and technical agencies and international technical agencies, from the Caribbean to attend at any time during the construction of the model.
